



#### LAUDATO SI ACTION PLAN REFLECTION

- St Therese is a two-stream school, with approximately 370 students and 30 staff. We pride ourselves on being a happy, calm school, where all students are provided with an environment conducive to effective learning and strong friendships. We aim to provide a broad education, focused on the important skills of Literacy and Numeracy, while not forgetting critical thinking, appreciation of the arts and knowledge of our world. Each child's spiritual needs are also taken into account by the provision of Religious Education, prayer, worship and reflection time.
- The charism of St Therese Catholic Primary School has its foundations in the Good Samaritan ethos, which includes love of learning. This Benedictine Charism also reminds us that all things are holy since they come from the hand of God and so we have a duty 'to cultivate and take care of' the good things of God's creation. This influences our engagement with stewardship and environmental action and education at our school.
- We are also influenced by the life of our Patron Saint, St Therese of Lisieux, from whom we take our motto "Love can do all things". Love translates to respect and showing compassion for others, all of creation and to have an outward-looking approach to life.
- Pope Francis in Laudato Si' reminds us that it is through the "little daily actions" that we can make a contribution to caring for our common home, which finds connections in the life of St Therese who made it her mission to live her life "doing the little things really well".
- This School Environmental Management Plan (SEMP) is a tool that will enable us to document, implement, reflect and celebrate sustainability as we respond to the challenges from Laudato Si' to walk our own journey of ecological conversion. At St Therese we understand that we have a missionary and ecclesial mandate that impels us to participate and respond to the call to care for our common home with strategic planning, formation and concrete actions and it is within this context that this SEMP is formulated.

Since 2015 following the release of Laudato Si', Catholic Education Diocese of Wollongong has taken seriously Pope Francis' prophetic call for an ecological conversion and has proactively responded in a strategic, planned approach whereby sustainable practices and ecological values are promoted and supported across the system of schools in the Wollongong diocese.

St Therese Cathoic Primary School plans to continue with ecological and sustainable practices.

Engagement with eco-spirituality, environmental education and action is a key component of our mission, of being Catholic and is viewed as "core business", not an "optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience" (LS n217)

This strategic approach has involved schools embedding ecological values into school programs and practices that promote an ecological and sustainable culture, encouraging everyone to live out his/her ecological vocation and engage in caring for our common home.

- St Therese Catholic Primary follows the CEDoW Environmental Education Action Policy. Each year every grade actively participates in writing and implementing a unit of work based upon the requirements of the Environmental Education policy.
- St Therese Catholic Primary School has completed a School Environment Management Plan (SEMP 1). WE have planned and are currently completing the goals outlined in SEMP2 and will be ongoing till 2024 (2021-2024). Professional Development and Staff Formation in eco-spirituality, eco-theology and ecological conversion
- The St Therese Catholic Primary School Staff has participated in a Staff Spirituality Day led by Beth Riolo Who Is My Neighbour focussing on eco-spirituality, eco-theology and ecological conversion. This Professional Development guided and promoted a further understanding of Ecological Conversion.
- St Therese Catholic Primary School will apply for a grant through the CEDoW Environmental Education Grants Program in December 2022.
- St Therese Catholic Primary School is an active member of Wollongong Environment Network (WEN) that aims to support the school communities to respond to Laudato Si' and implement environmental stewardship and sustainability.
- St Therese Catholic Primary School has attained a Level 3 Certification Earthcare School

- As part of our vision St Therese Catholic Primary School is inspired by Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor and Bishop Brian's Diocesan Pastoral Message. Bishop Brian's Diocesan Pastoral Message

At St Therese the community has been engaged in various environmental actions and initiatives.

The following is an outline of past environmental action:

- School wide recycling systems BLUE (clean paper), YELLOW (recyclables),
   RED (landfill), GREEN (compost)
- Composting Area and Worm farm. Each class contributes to the compost each day with their crunch and sip fruit and vegetable scraps. This is maintained by Year Five students
- School Recycling Initiative: **Terracycle** yoghurt pouches, toothbrushes, floss holders, toothpaste tubes, shampoo, conditioner and moisturiser bottles

- Water tank with the grey water used for toilet flushing
  - Solar panels on administration area roof
  - LED replacement lights throughout the school
  - Water cooler/refillable station for students
  - Catering changes crockery for hospitality events involving parents/carers

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The following is an outline of future environmental actions: 2021-2023

Action Sharing of SEMP II and promotion of specific environmental actions that staff can be involved in

Action: Create an award to be given to a student from each class who has exemplified care for God's creation and connection to the environment in both words and action.

Action Re-invigorate the Environmental Committee that includes both Teachers and Students. 2021

Action Explore avenues for sourcing an annual budget for environmental initiatives and maintenance as well as time allocation for WEN Contact responsibilities.2021

Action Incorporate an environmental duty (supervision of the Environmental Student Committee around environmental actions) into the staff playground roster. 2021

Action Staff engage in Spirituality Day exploring ecological conversion, eco theology and eco spirituality. 2023

Action Staff engage in professional development on the seven goals of the Laudato Si' Action Platform.2023

Action: At Staff Meeting/or Stage meeting there is time given to check and update the following: key environmental unit for each Year level, identifying cross curriculum links for sustainability (and Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander, Asia and Its Neighbours) programming, scope and sequences. 2023

Action: Staff to better utilise IT (Apple TV, google classroom) in lieu of photocopying and excess printing. (Ongoing)

Action: Develop Green Catering Procedures written for canteen, school and hospitality events. 2023
