As members of the SJAA Committee we feel a part of and a deep connection to others in the group with similar concerns as raised by Pope Francis in Laudato Si.

One of the areas where we come together is in our shared Catholic heritage and practices. We share wonderful social events together in a true spirit of friendship and love.

Our monthly meetings are a sort of clearinghouse of ideas, inspiration and calls to action to stimulate each other and share our struggles.

As a microcosm of persons with varying perspectives that come to light and are focused on during our discussions, we grow as a group more than with just in our individual parts.

Buy electric vehicles
