LSAP PROCESS

The Archdiocese of Chicago Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) Action Plan begins where its LSAP Reflection document ended — with PROCESS.

SEE-JUDGE-ACT


Central to all our actions in inculcating the teachings of Laudato Si' and implementing the Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) is the wisdom found in the SEE-JUDGE-ACT model.

This method of social analysis and action is based on the principles of Catholic Social Teaching. It consists of three steps:

SEE

Observe the social reality and the situations of injustice that affect society.

To genuinely "see" something is an activity that involves more than capturing a glimpse of an environment or the condition of a person. Seeing



requires a full array of sensory input. Hearing, smelling, tasting and touching all play supporting roles in our observation of creation if we are to experience the lived reality of individuals and communities.

JUDGE

Evaluate the causes and consequences of the problems using the criteria of faith and reason and the guidance of the Church's social doctrine. Social analysis and theological reflection are necessary components.

A plethora of information bombards us as we work to evaluate what we observe, navigating truths, half-truths and falsehoods. Sometimes we second guess ourselves and our judgements are all too human. It is in these doubt-ridden situations that we need to look to our faith and prayer, scripture and tradition and turn to the wisdom of those who have gone before us with the understanding that our judgements will impact future generations.

ACT

Decide and implement the actions that are needed to transform the situation that is contributing to suffering and injustice and promote the common good.

Realism is an essential component of action. The enormity of our present reality can be numbing, but pausing to pray for the wisdom to know what is doable, what may cause us to stretch and what is seemingly impossible is always prudent. The adages about going after the low hanging fruit and stopping the hemorrhage are generally good places to start, remembering that taking no action is in fact an act.

LSAP INTEGRATED ACTION

RESPONSE TO THE CRY OF THE EARTH

Outcome: Protect the Climate.

Action: Transition to Renewable Energies (LSAP 1.1 – 1.3).

- **Phase 1:** Electric Usage: Connect with stakeholders, assess, quantify, audit and prepare for transition in select diocesan buildings and up to six parishes considered energy efficient.
- **Phase 2:** Consult with solar professionals familiar with various solar array systems, community solar and funding.

RESPONSE TO THE CRY OF THE POOR

Outcome: Ensure members of the community have access to WASH services.

Action: Ensure access to clean water (LSAP 2.3).

- **Phase 1:** Continue working with the Catholic Conference of Illinois on the Pastoral Statement on Water Quality and Sustainability.
- **Phase 2:** Identify high-risk areas of the AOC for lead contamination and set up pilot information/ awareness-raising program.

ECOLOGICAL ECONOMICS

Outcome: Ensure financial investments are ethical and sustainable.

Action: Better align AOC investment practices with USCCB's Socially Responsible Investment Guidelines (LSAP 3.3 – 3.4).

- **Phase 1:** Develop an ethos of impact investing within the Finance Department and its Investing Sub-Committees with a focus on transitioning AOC's energy portfolio to renewable energies.
- **Phase 2:** Resource expertise to educate and advise in planning, development and implementation of the transition.

ADOPTION OF SUSTAINABLE LIFESTYLES

Outcome: Improve Sustainability in Consumer Purchases.

Action: Eliminate the use of disposable plastic and Styrofoam (LSAP 4.11).

- **Phase 1:** Audit the use of single-use plastics and Styrofoam to determine where and when these materials are most frequently used. Consider all uses, such as preparing and serving meals, events and hospitality.
- **Phase 2:** Develop policy for all departments regarding the use of single-use server ware.

ECOLOGICAL EDUCATION

Outcomes: Develop Laudato Si' learning opportunities.

Actions: Develop and Implement a Laudato Si' Action Platform education plan (LSAP 5.1).

- **Phase 1:** Develop an integrated educational curriculum that fosters the teachings of Laudato Si'/ LSAP and ecological virtues.
- **Phase 2:** Facilitate professional development to integrate LSAP Goals and teachings of Laudato Si' across all educational disciplines.

ECOLOGICAL SPIRITUALITY

Outcomes: Weave Laudato Si' themes into religious practices.

Actions: Regularly include Laudato Si' themes in shared prayers to recover a spiritual vision of God's creation (LSAP 6.11).

- **Phase 1:** Develop a Laudato Si' vehicle within the AOC's internal communication channels where Pastoral Center Staff can respond to weekly/monthly prompts that promote reflection on the places and people that bring them closer to God.
- **Phase 2:** Launch Laudato Si' vehicle within the AOC's internal communication channels where staff can blog in response to weekly/monthly prompts that promote reflection on the themes and goals of Laudato Si'.
- **Phase 3:** Gradually transition prompts to reflections on the connections between the LSAP themes/goals and their responsibilities at home and at work to care for our common home.

COMMUNITY RESILIENCE AND EMPOWERMENT

Outcome: Advocate for Social and Ecological Causes.

Action: Identify an ecological social/environmental policy focus (LSAP 7.1).

• **Phase 1:** Conduct an audit of issues of concern in the diocese. If possible, base this audit on archdiocesan efforts in the areas of "Response to the Cry of the Poor" and "Response to the Cry of the Earth."

Outcome: Develop a Social Response to Shared Challenges.

Action: Develop a community coalition to prepare for and respond to emergent crises (LSAP 7.11).

• **Phase 2:** Create or join alliances of local groups such as Catholic or other faith agencies or civil society organizations to encourage more just social and environmental policies together.
